Vicarage Lane - The two Blackney estate houses should have renovations done. They are unsightly and ruin the look of the lane. Blackney Estate should renovate them and put nice hedges around them. It ruins the look of the lane and is unsightly - especially as we have the war memorial here. Sopwick Church - The trees behind the church have been left to grow too high and it is overgrown. The Holy Cross church is a Grade 2 listed building and it is disgusting that the grounds are overgrown. Those trees the roots will have a deep impact on damaging the walls and the bungalows that are situated behind the church. This will cause structural damage to the pathway on the side of the church and the bungalow on the side of the church. I feel that the parish should also indicate what they do with monies raised in the village of Scopwick, we have had several functions in the village hall to raise funds for the playing field. Over £1,000.00 was raised and rumors indicated the playing field would have new look but nothing happens. We also have a beautiful Grade 2 listed church that we cannot see its beauty because the trees are too tall and overgrown adding damp - possible future structural damage to the church itself and walls and the drainage pipes in the ground and The Parish and Council should have them cut and pruned or some of the trees removed from the back of the Holy Cross church. You walk there and it looks terrible and you can see the damage to the wall again. Think of the structural damage that the roots will be doing to the surrounding bungalows and cottages. Vicarage Lane - The 2 Blankney Estate properties looks like driving into a council estate, they have broken fences - the houses look like they are full of damp and look ugly. Those of us that live on Vicarage Lane we pay high council tax and feel let down. We have the War memorial that people travel far to visit and as you enter Vicarage Lane those two houses look delapted and so shaming the look of the lane. Its terrible for those that have to see that in Farriers Court.

This Neighbourhood Plan is fundamentally unnecessary and unlikely to become approved because of the limited scope of possible improvement. The Central Lincolnshire Plan provides most of the protection and definition of possible development for Tier 3 villages. Any energy and funding available should be directed to enhancing community activities and encouraging the participation of residents

We love the character of the village and don't want to change that. We feel very proud of the Beck and all of the lovely stone houses. We also feel that the war graves are a very important part of the village and feel fortunate to have so many footpaths nearby. We just wish that the Limes Care Home could be replaced with some attractive houses and the speed limit could be reduced on the B1188 and the intersection of that and Main street could be made safer. A speed camera or reduction to 30mph on the B1188 would do a lot to calm traffic and reduce the number of accidents. An extension to the pavement from the Royal Oak to Almonds Green would also be helpful
